The Importance of Supporting High Potential Learners and Illinois' Recent Policy Advances

Carolyn Welch, J.D., serves as Policy & Advocacy Co-Chair of the Illinois Association for Gifted Children (IAGC). She will discuss the Accelerated Placement Act and other recent legislative successes, key research and equity data showing the importance of policy supports for high-ability students, the impact of parent and stakeholder involvement in gifted education advocacy efforts, and what the new laws require.

Susan Rhodes is a member of the Gifted Advisory Council of the Illinois State Board of Education, IAGC Past President, and former founding principal of Iles Gifted Magnet School, part of Springfield Public Schools. She will give a high-level overview of how to develop and implement policies supporting advanced learners that are rooted in best practices, as well as highlight available resources for administrators and teachers seeking to better serve these students, including a new Administrators Academy on Acceleration.

Kathleen Nilles, Parent Services & Communications Manager at the National Association for Gifted Children, will address concerns that unite parents at various stages of their gifted children's development and speak about resources and supports that exist for parents and parent groups.

Carolyn Welch is an education lawyer who represents students with various needs and abilities, their families, and the schools they attend, including special needs students and schools in underserved communities. As an advocate for gifted children from all backgrounds, she serves as Co-Chair of Policy and Advocacy for the Illinois Association for Gifted Children, Chairman of the Midwest Center for the Gifted, and as a member of the Legislative and Advocacy Committee for the National Association for Gifted Children. Carolyn's experiences as a parent of two gifted children helps fuel her passion for improving the education policy framework on behalf of all high-ability students. Successful IAGC advocacy efforts include the recent passage of the IL Accelerated Placement Act and the Report Card Act in 2017. Carolyn received her J.D. from the Georgetown University Law Center.



Susan Rhodes serves on the ISBE Gifted Advisory Council and assisted in the development and training of the Gifted Education Seminar. Susan began her teaching career in Walnut, IL, served as a staff development coordinator at Educational Service Center #8 in Sterling, IL in the early nineties, became the mathematics and gifted education coordinator for Springfield Public Schools, was instrumental in opening a public gifted magnet school in 2000, served as building principal for nine years, and attained International Baccalaureate Programme authorization for Iles School. Susan continues to be active within the Illinois Association for Gifted Children and is the current Past President.



Kathleen Nilles has served as the Parent Services & Communications Manager for the National Association of Gifted Children (NAGC) in Washington, D.C. since 2013. In this role, Kathleen edits Parenting for High Potential magazine and serves as the outreach liaison contact for parents, grandparents, and caregivers of gifted and talented children. She has extensive experience in creating and implementing professional development, training, and communications programs for various audiences within the gifted population, including parents, educators, psychologists, and specialists. She is a frequent presenter at national and state conferences, workshops, and seminars to educators and parents. Kathleen holds a master's degree from Northeastern Illinois University in gifted education, and dual bachelor's degrees in public relations and business management.
